A FIRST FOR ETHIOPIA



Belachew Tessema, M.D., a specialist in otolaryngology, sinus, and nasal disorders, and a member of Saint Francis' Medical Staff, recently performed Ethiopia's first endoscopic sinus surgery during a medical mission to the country organized in collaboration with the non-profit group Healing the Children. Dr. Tessema, of The Connecticut Sinus Institute and ProHealth Physicians, holds an appointment as an Assistant Clinical Professor at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. He led a team that included a chief resident in otolaryngology from the UConn Health Center, three other otolaryngologists, a pediatric anesthesiologist, two audiologists, a pediatrician, and a nurse. The team worked in the capital of Addis Ababa at the Mekanisa School for the Deaf, two referral centers, and Black Lion Hospital, an academic tertiary care institution. The team examined more than 300 patients, performed 36 complex ENT surgeries, and provided didactic sessions for local physicians. Supplies for the trip were provided by the Saint Francis Foundation through the Hospital's Mission Integration Program.
